It is very important that you find out at your own university exactly which program you are in, since the forms to be filled in and the specific information included in this brochure are different for each program.

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



Universitas Studii Salmanticensis

The University of Salamanca, founded in 1218 by King Alphonsus IX of León, is one of the oldest universities in Europe and has been an academic point of reference throughout its almost 800 years of existence, taking in uncountable generations of students from all parts of the globe.

The University reached its maximum splendour in the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries, when it became the centre of a worldwide debate on human rights. Its Senate argued about Columbus's project, and once America had been discovered, it argued about the right of indigenous peoples to have their rights fully recognized. It also had among its students what were probably the first women university students in the world, one of whom was the first to teach in a university.

Today the University of Salamanca upholds its academic and research excellence, and together with other European universities is in a process of adapting its teachings to the new "European Higher Education Area" which seeks to place the student at the centre of learning.




The University of Salamanca has Centres in different towns: Ávila, Béjar, Salamanca, Villamayor and Zamora.

Most Centres are located in the city of Salamanca, which has a population of more than 142,000. At a distance of 200 km from Madrid, Salamanca is a dynamic and open city, a true university town.

The university centres in Salamanca are located in different parts of town: some are in the Old Quarter and others in peripheral areas situated at about 20 minutes' walk from the city centre.

A.2.1 Before arriving in Salamanca

2.1.1. Student visa

The following students do not need a student visa

- \cdot Students who are citizens of any of the member States of the European Union.
- Students who are citizens of any country that has ratified the agreement of the free circulation of citizens (Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Switzerland).
- For stays of less than 90 days (3 months), the citizens of countries on the common list of Third Countries whose citizens are not required to have a visa for member States.

A visa is necessary for all those students from non-EU countries who plan to reside in Spain for more than 3 months. A student visa to enter and legally remain in Spain must be applied for at the Spanish Embassy or Consulate in the student's country of origin or residence.

DEPENDING ON THE DURATION OF THE STAY, THERE ARE TWO TYPES OF STUDENT VISAS:

- · Student visa for a maximum of 180 days. Students cannot ask for a visa extension.
- Long term visa for studies lasting longer than 180 days. Within a month of your entry into Spain you must apply for an authorization for a study stay (AUTORIZACIÓN DE ESTANCIA POR ESTUDIOS) at the Office for Foreigners in the Salamanca Police Station. This visa can be extended for as long as you are registered at the University.

Students planning to study for more than a semester at the University of Salamanca should apply for a long term visa.

STUDENT VISA APPLICATION:

The Office of International Relations of the University of Salamanca will send a letter of acceptance to your university which is needed in order to apply for the student visa before coming to Spain.

Take this letter of acceptance to the Spanish embassy or consulate in your country to begin processing your visa application.

2.1.2. Health and mobility insurance

All students participating in international mobility programmes are required to purchase the mandatory mobility insurance of the University of Salamanca, regardless of the requirements of the students' home university on this regard. This insurance shall be signed up by each student directly through the website provided by the International Relations Office prior to the student's trip.

If we have not received a copy of the mandatory insurance before traveling to Salamanca, students will not be able to formalize their enrolment.

Furthermore, each student must also verify in their own country all the obligations and/or conditions relating to health care in Spain.



A.2.2 **Accommodation**

You may reserve accommodation before your arrival or after you have reached the city.

How to get to the University of Salamanca

The University of Salamanca has different Campuses in the towns of Ávila, Béjar, Salamanca, Villamayor y Zamora (distances from Salamanca below).

HOW DO I GET TO SALAMANCA?

The most common way to come is through Madrid, although you might also come through Irun on the Northern French border or from Barcelona. You can get to Salamanca by train (http://www.renfe.es) or by bus (several companies) from all of these points.

There are several ways to get to Salamanca from Madrid.

· If you arrive at MADRID-BARAJAS, airport, there is a Bus Service from T1 and T4 to Salamanca.

To get from the airport to Madrid city, you can take the "Metro":

- To go from Madrid-Barajas Airport to Estación de Autobuses Sur Méndez Alvaro: take line 8 to "Nuevos Ministerios", then change to line 6 and get off at the bus station.
- To go from Madrid-Barajas Airport to Chamartín railway station: take line 8 to "Nuevos Ministerios", then change to line 10 and get off at Chamartín.

2.4.1. Climate

Salamanca has a continental climate, with strong contrasts in seasonal temperatures. Winter temperatures range between -2° and 15° C, and summer temperatures, between 20° and 35° C.

2.4.2. General cost of living and currency

Student expenses will vary according to the type of accommodation. However, €1.000 a month is the approximate amount needed to cover basic costs of rent, transport, food, etc. Spain's currency is the Euro.



2.4.3. Bank accounts

It is easy to open an account in one of the many banks operating in the city with a passport or official ID card. Some bank offices may ask for the NIE (Número de Identificación para Extranjeros, Foreign Citizens Identification Number), which can be obtained at the Oficina de Extranjería (Foreign Affairs Office): c/ Gran Vía 31.



2.4.4. Public transport

There are several metropolitan bus lines for getting around in Salamanca, Béjar, Ávila and Zamora.

In Salamanca tickets can be purchased on the bus for one ride and different types of pass cards can be purchased at the offices of Salamanca Transportes (Gran V(a, 4) and recharged on any bus or at the offices.



The University of Salamanca participates in the Erasmus Programme, which is a programme of European Community Action in the sphere of university student mobility, and maintains inter-institutional agreements with a large number of European institutions of higher education.

1.1.1. Who can participate

This program allows selected students from European universities holding inter-institutional agreements with the University of Salamanca to study for a full academic year or a semester at the University of Salamanca.

1.1.2. Selection at the home university

Students must not apply directly for admission to the University of Salamanca. The office of international relations or mobility office at the home university is in charge of sending the list of students selected for the Erasmus program each academic year to the Office of International Relations of the University of Salamanca.

1.1.3. Nomination

The home university must send a list of their Erasmus nominees to the Office of International Relations, including the following information:

- Name(s) and surname(s) of the students.
- E-mail address.
- Area of study (according to bilateral agreement).
- Period of study in Salamanca.
- Study level (Undergraduate, Master, Doctorate).

The deadline for sending the list is July, 1st, 2025 (for all applicants).

Nominations must conform to the terms of each Erasmus agreement concerning the area of study, study level and the number of students. Any change to these conditions must have the prior approval of the University of Salamanca.

1.1.4. Application documents

Students duly nominated by their home institution must complete the on-line Erasmus Application Form, print it and send it by email to the International Relations Office (erasmus-in@usal.es), together with a recent passport-size photograph and a copy of the ID document or passport. The on-line Erasmus Application Form is available on our web site:

https://rel-int.usal.es/en/students/incoming-students/erasmus-student-mobility-for-studies The deadline for receiving applications is July, 1th 2025.

Following the correct reception of the application form, students will be sent an acceptance letter to be presented at the corresponding centre of the University of Salamanca when registering.

1.1.5. Health and mobility insurances

- · All Erasmus students must take out the **mobility insurance of the University of Salamanca**, regardless the requirements of the student's home institution on this regard. This insurance policy shall be signed up by each student directly via the website.
- $\cdot \ \, \text{Detailed instructions on hiring this insurance will be sent prior to the student's trip.}$

• Health Care: Students from the EU, EFTA and Switzerland are entitled to medical care in the medical centres and hospitals that form part of or have agreements with the Spanish National Health System (Seguridad Social). Students must apply for the European Health Card (EIHC) at the health service offices in their country of origin (GHIC for UK students). Foreign students from other countries than the above-mentioned or who are not covered by national health plans must have private health insurance.

A proof of having taken out both insurances will be a mandatory requirement in order to formalise the inscription at the University of Salamanca and receive the student card (which allows access to University services, such as libraries, computer rooms or the University digital platform).

Students must send, before their arrival in Salamanca, a copy of both documents either by e-mail to the International Relations Office (*erasmus-in@usal.es*).



B.1.2 Preparing your stay

1.2.1. Contrato de Estudios (Learning Agreement)

The University of Salamanca is connected with the EWP-network and accepts **Online Learning Agreements**.

The OLA/ Learning Agreement must be sent for approval and signature to the corresponding International Departmental Coordinator in Salamanca.

Please do not send Learning Agreements to the International Relations Office; they will not be attended or redirected.

1.2.2. Accommodation and other practical information

he Office of International Relations of the University of Salamanca does not find accommodation for students. The students themselves should look after this, in accordance with their personal preferences.

*Information on student accommodation can be found in Section A.2.2 of the General Part of this brochure (page 10).

1.2.3. Spanish course for Erasmus students

The language of instruction at our institution is Spanish. Students must have sufficient Spanish skills before coming in order to be able to follow lectures. A minimum level of B1 is recommended, although no certificate is required. The University of Salamanca offers, at the beginning of each semester (October and February/March) an intensive course of Spanish language whose aim is to consolidate and improve the Spanish language proficiency. The course is 3 weeks long and has a total of 30 class hours, distributed in 2 hours a day, from Monday to Friday. Students must pay 204 € for course materials and linguistic consulting.

Students will receive by email the information regarding registration (deadline, instructions, etc.).

Once enrolled, students will be given a placement test to determine their level of Spanish in order to organize the different groups.

Starting out at the University of Salamanca

Below is a list of steps to follow when you first arrive in Salamanca:

1. International Coordinator at the Centre.

Students must contact the International Coordinator at their Centre in Salamanca for any Erasmus document: signature of arrival and stay certificates and Learning Agreement, choice of subjects and enrolment.

Any academic questions should also be addressed to them (see the list of International Coordinators on pages 14-21).

2. Enrolment in the University of Salamanca

After speaking to the Coordinator, you should go to the Registry Office of the Centre (Secretaría) to enrol, after which you will be given a receipt. Any certificate you may need can also be obtained there. Any change in address, e-mail or telephone number during your stay in Salamanca must be reported to the Administration of the Centre and to the Office of International Relations.

We will inform you by email about your student card.

3. Certificates

When your period of stay is over, you must ask the International Coordinator at your Centre to sign your stay certificate. Once the examination period is ended, the Registry Office of your Centre will send your transcrip of records to your home university.

2.1.1. Selection at the home university

Students must not apply directly for admission to the University of Salamanca. The office in charge of international relations or mobility at their home university is in charge of sending the list of students selected to participate in the mobility to the Office of International Relations of the University of Salamanca, the selected students name and surname, passport number, e-mail, the length of their stay and their study area.

2.1.2. Who can participate

This program comprises two types of exchange grants:

• Exchange grants for a semester or for the whole academic year:

Selected students can study for a period of a semester or a complete academic year at the University of Salamanca.

Summer study grants:

Selected students can take a 2 to 4-week Spanish course with three hours of class daily in July or August. Should ask in their home university about the specific conditions under which they are participating in this program.

2.1.3. Paperwork and deadlines

EXCHANGE GRANT FOR FULL ACADEMIC YEAR OR SEMESTER

- Students selected by their home university will receive an email with a link to an application form that they must fill out.
- In order to receive the acceptance letter, students have to send by email to *intercambio-in@usal.es* the following documents:
 - Passport, or valid national ID card
 - Compulsory insurance
- The online application form is essential for participating in this programme.

The deadlines for sending these application forms are:

- Full Year (September June): From February 10th to May 31st.
- First Semester (September January): From February 10th to May 31st.
- Second Semester (January June): From June 1st to November 15th.

- Students selected by their home university will receive an email with a link to an application form that they must fill out.
- The deadline for sending this form is before 31, May 2025.

Summer Exchange Students are not requested to subscribe the Insurance because it is included in their Summer Courses managed by Cursos Internacionales.

2.1.4. Admission procedure

The acceptance letters so that students can apply for their study visa will be sent by the International Relations Service to the students and to their home university.

B.2.2 Preparing your stay

2.2.1. Documents that students should bring to USAL

- Passport, or valid national ID card. Once in Salamanca, you should use the same document for identification and enrolment.
- Letter of acceptance from the University of Salamanca which they have to show at the secretary of the center in which they will have to enroll.
- · Documents for compulsory health and repatriation insurance of the University of Salamanca.
- Student visa (only for non-EU students).
- All foreign students who participate in international mobility programs are required to acquire mobility.

 insurance policy established by the University of Salamanca, regardless of the requirements of your own university in this matter.
- Each student must also verify in his or her own country all obligations and/or conditions related to medical care in Spain.

2.2.2. Accommodation and other practical information

EXCHANGE GRANTS FOR FULL ACADEMIC YEAR OR SEMESTER

The Office of International Relations of the University of Salamanca will help you as much as possible to find accommodation. You must find out at your own university about the specific conditions of the agreement signed between your university

and the University of Salamanca in this sense.

All students who are going to reside in University Residence Halls must make a security deposit, which should be paid as soon as they are notified of acceptance. This deposit will be returned at the end of the stay if no damage has been done to the installations or material of the Residence Hall in question. If the student leaves the residence hall before the end of the period established, the deposit will not be returned.

SUMMER STUDY GRANTS

Depending on the specific conditions of each agreement, the University of Salamanca will cover the costs established in each case.

2.2.3. Spanish course for full academic year and semester exchange grant students

The University of Salamanca offers an Intensive Course in Spanish (https://ci.usal.es/erasmus/) to all students holding an exchange grant who wish to take it. Classes are held for two hours a day for three weeks.

This is a pre-registration only. Students must then formally enrol in the Spanish Course in the International Courses Office and pay 204 euros.

Students who wish to take this course in September should be aware that if that course is full they can enrol for the courses taking place in October or November. Once enrolled, the students are given a placement test in order to organize the different groups according to language level.

B.2.3 Starting out at University of Salamanca

B.3.1 Mobility procedure

The University of Salamanca fosters the mobility of international undergraduate students within the framework of the agreements signed with other institutions. These students can construct their own program of studies by choosing from the subjects included in official degree programs.

3.1.1. Who can participate

Undergraduate students enrolled in an institution of higher education with which the University of Salamanca has a Collaboration Agreement in force and who have sufficient fluency in Spanish to be able to follow classes.

A minimum level of B1 is recommended.

Grants for foreign students are not available.

3.1.2. Selection at the home university

Students must not apply directly for admission to the University of Salamanca. The office in charge of international relations or mobility at the home university is in charge of sending the list of students selected to participate in the mobility to the Office of International Relations and Cooperation of the University of Salamanca.

Extension of the stay period must be requested by the home university in a letter to the University of Salamanca two months before the start of the semester for which the request is being made. The University of Salamanca may accept or reject that request depending on the space available in the degree course in question.

In all cases the students must fulfill the requirements established by the prevailing legislation regarding student visas in order to extend their stay (see section A.2.1 of the General Part, page 9).

3.1.3. Paperwork and deadlines

Students should not send any forms. The student's home university must send the following documents scanned to the Office of International Relations:

- · A list of students indicating the duration of their stay and the area of study.
- Application form signed by the student with two photographs, 3 cm wide x 3.5 cm high, after having registered the application online according to the instructions on the website:

- Academic transcript, that is, a list of university subjects taken and the corresponding grades.
- Photocopy of the student's passport or national identity card.
- A copy of the insurance purchased by the student.

*DEADLINES FOR SENDING THESE DOCUMENTS:

- Before 31 May, 2025: for students coming for the first semester or the full academic year.
- Before 31 October, 2025: for students coming for the second semester.

Applications that arrive past the due date or those that have not been registered on line will not be processed.

3.1.4. Admission procedure

No students will be admitted to the following degree courses: Nursing, Physical Therapy, Medicine or Dentistry.

Also, places are limited in Economics and Business, Psychology, Fine Arts, and Translation and Documentation; in this program students will be admitted according

to the order in which their applications have been received until the limit established by the faculties are reached.

The Office of International Relations will send by mail a letter of acceptance to the students' home university so that they can apply for their student visa. The original letter will be sent only at the request of the university. For more information, write to: movconvenios@usal.es

1. HOW TO ENROL

All students in the agreement program must enrol in the Personalized Student Learning Plan (PCI):

All administrative questions relating to enrolment should be addressed to this office: payment of fees, course cards, certificates, grades, etc.

2. ENROLMENT CONDITIONS

- Students can enrol in a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 6 subjects each semester. They must be subjects included in the study plans of official degree programs offered at the University of Salamanca.
- In some subjects, due to their practical nature, only a limited number of students may enrol. In these cases the University of Salamanca reserves the right to admission. For more information, contact International Courses programa.pci@usal.es
- There is a period to request an exchange or an elimination of the chosen courses. After that period of time no further changes will be accepted on any of the chosen courses.
- Students selected for a semester stay must enrol in semester-long subjects only.
- Enrolment in year-long subjects should be done at the beginning of the academic year, i.e. September.
- Students must take the exams on the dates set out in the academic handbook of the degree program at which they are attending classes. If a student wishes to take the re-take exam on the date specified, he or she must make a written request to the International Courses Office. This exam date cannot be brought forward for any reason.

3. ENROLMENT PERIODS

- · Year-long and first semester subjects: enrolment in August, 2025.
- · Second semester subjects: enrolment in December 2025/January, 2026.

Students should plan to arrive in Salamanca early enough before classes begin to get settled in and complete all the paperwork needed for enrolment in the period stipulated by International Courses.

4. ENROLMENT FEE

Enrolment fees refer to the cost of registering for the subjects chosen by the student and give the student the right to attend class, to be evaluated by the corresponding professor, to obtain an academic certificate listing the grades obtained and to make use of the installations of the University of Salamanca: libraries, computer rooms, etc.

The amount of the fees will depend on the total number of credits assigned to the subjects chosen, plus general administration costs. The International Courses office updates the cost of credits and administration fees every academic year.

5. STUDENT CARD

Once you have registered, the Office of International Courses will inform you by email about the procedure to get your student card.

6. CERTIFICATES

After exams have been taken the students will be given a personalized certificate of their studies listing the subjects taken, the grades obtained and the number of credits received (transcript). This certificate should be requested at the Office of International Courses before they return home.

In no case will the subjects students take under the auspices of the Personalized Student Learning Plan (PCI) be considered as leading to an official university degree from the University of Salamanca. However, the studies carried out can be recognized by the student's home university according to its own criteria.
